**MINOR: Women Studies**

Women Studies focus on gender, diversity, multicultural learning, critical thinking, leadership development, advocacy for women's and community issues, and the integration of knowledge into life choices. Students engage in community service through involvement in local organizations

and advocacy programs, and participate in a range of activities such as art exhibits, theater performances, films, conferences, and seminars. The benefits of a Women Studies degree include strong critical-thinking and analytical skills developed in a student-centered environment that encourages independent thought; the experience of applying what students learn in the classroom to the world beyond, through internships and service learning; and insights into questions of gender, diversity, and power central to any workplace. Graduates of Women Studies find successful careers in a range of fields including the arts, business, education, health care, media, politics and law, social work, psychology, and sports.

The Women Studies program offers a major and a minor, described below.

**DEGREE: Bachelor of Arts**

**MAJOR: Women Studies**

Degree requirements for the major include 12 credit hours of required Women Studies courses, including one of either "WS 201G, Introduction to Women Studies" or "WS 202, Representing Women Across Cultures" and the Women Studies Practicum, a project-based seminar, to be taken as the first and last Women Studies courses, respectively; 6 credit hours of Women Studies electives; and 18 credit hours from a number of cross-listed courses offered both by Women Studies and by other programs/departments. The total credit hour requirement for the major is 36 credit hours with 21 hours at the upper division level. All requirements must be completed with a grade of "C" or higher.

**MINOR: Women Studies**

A minor in Women Studies consists of 18 or more credit hours of approved course work in Women Studies of which at least 9 are upper division (300 level or above).

 Senior Seminar, select one of the following (3 credit hours): WS 451, Practicum; WS 461, Independent Study; or WS 471, Seminar in Feminist Theory..... 3  
 Nine additional credits from the Women Studies approved curriculum, of which at least 6 credits are upper division..... 9

Note: A student may not earn a bachelor's degree in Women Studies and also earn a minor in Women Studies.
